HERITAGE RECEPTION




Heritage level members will enjoy a private reception at the stunning Walnut Grove. This Greek Revival residence has been occupied by the original family since 1837 and was the home of Confederate General P.M.B. Young, the youngest general in the Civil War and the first in the South to be seated in Congress. See Civil War memorabilia on display and an 1847 Chickering piano. Explore the out-buildings and historic boxwood garden propagated from family cuttings brought from Spartanburg, SC.




Friday afternoon's Ramble will take you to the most elegant homes in Cartersville. Explore a variety of historic home styles including an 1860 Folk Victorian farmhouse and a 1939 Colonial Revival with original ornate lattice work. Tour the unique 1840 home, formerly known as Overlook, which includes an observatory that holds what was once the second largest telescope in the South. End your afternoon tour at the fascinating Etowah Indian Mounds, built by indigenous people around 1000 CE.

SATURDAY AFTERNOON RAMBLE * Noon to 5 p.m.



Spend the afternoon discovering sites in downtown Cartersville. Order a hot dog at the 1931 Four Way Lunch or a meat-and-three at the 1945 Ross's Diner. The tour features grand homes, most notably: White Columns, a Preservation Award nominee recently saved and rehabilitated by Georgia Trust board member Ron Goss; and the spectacular Roselawn, an 1860 Victorian masterpiece owned by the late evangelist Sam Jones and named for the many rose bushes along the fences and walkways of the estate.

This beautiful property, once included the nearby Etowah Indian Mounds, originally acquired as a result of the 1830 Georgia Land Lottery. The Tumlins are a founding family of Cartersville and served as caretakers of the mounds for 120 years. The farm features the original 1842 home and ornate gardens including Celtic, Southwestern and Williamsburg sections.

Saturday evening is sure to be a special treat for Ramblers. Enjoy a cocktail reception at the Bartow History Museum before walking over to the Booth Western Art Museum where a fabulous meal will be prepared by popular Georgia caterer Lee Epting. You'll have free run of the museum, so plan time to browse the unique collections in the Modern West, Native Hands, Civil War and the Sculpture Court exhibits. This distinguished museum features the largest permanent exposition of Western art in the country.

Start your day in Cartersville with brunch at the breathtaking 1904 Greek Revival home Grand Oaks before travelling through the countryside to the town of Euharlee, virtually unchanged since the 1800s, and which features one of the oldest covered bridges in Georgia. See Valley View, an 1847 brick plantation home on a 270-acre farm and Summerland, home and organic farm to renowned Atlanta chef Anne Quatrano. Don't miss the 2013 Georgia Trust *Places in Peril* success story, Stilesboro Academy, before ending your day at the Leake Mounds.
