Let's Ramble to Roswell! Mark your calendars and plan to join us for the 2012 Annual Meeting and Spring Ramble on April 20-22, 2012.

Roswell, Georgia, just north of Atlanta and along the banks of the Chattahoochee River, has a small town ambiance and great natural beauty despite its proximity to the city. We'll discover its abundant charm and rich history while visiting grand antebellum homes surrounding Mimosa Boulevard, the homes and shops of Canton Street, a mill village along the banks of Vickery Creek, and several interesting sites just outside of town.

Friday night we'll dine alongside the river in a restored cotton mill and Saturday night we're having a good old fashioned barbecue on the grounds of Barrington Hall, the Greek Revival residence of one of the city's founders. Sunday's relaxing brunch will be at Smith Plantation, an antebellum farm complex.

You can come for a day or spend the weekend, exploring everything that historic Roswell has to offer. More adventurous Ramblers can discover the area on a bike or take a kayak down the 'Hooch. Nightlife in Roswell brings out its mystery and charm; Ramblers can take a spine-chilling ghost tour through the historic district, enjoy live theatre, or check out a local pub.

Preservation professionals and enthusiasts should plan to spend an extra day in Roswell, as the Statewide Preservation Conference begins on Thursday, April 19, and finishes up the next afternoon, just as the Spring Ramble begins. You'll have an opportunity to attend sessions on timely issues and plug into the statewide preservation network.



Start the weekend with registration at **Roswell's Cultural Arts Center**. On nearby Canton Street, Ramblers will tour graceful homes and quaint cottages. A little further out, visit several Victorian farmhouses, including one under restoration. A few miles further is **Chestnut Hill**, a 23-acre complex including historic structures clustered around the main house, an exact replica of an 1820s dogtrot constructed with period materials.

Friday evening's activities will be held at **Ivy Hall**, part of the rehabilitated Roswell Mill complex that overlooks Vickery Creek. The complex dates back to the mid 1830s, when Roswell King came to the area and established a manufacturing center. Cocktails and dinner will be followed by the 35th Annual Preservation Awards, when we celebrate the state's top preservationists and projects.

Sunday's brunch will be held at the gracious **Smith Plantation** (ca. 1845), which exemplifies the life of an affluent farm family in early Roswell. Furnished in Smith Family pieces, the main house features a parson's room. The complex includes 10 original outbuildings, including slave quarters and a springhouse.

MILL LIFE

SUNDAY RAMBLE 4.22

Roswell's prosperity centered around the production of cotton and cotton mills. Ramblers will explore the ruins of mill structures along **Vickery Creek**, the apartments and cottages of those who worked in them, a mill manager's home, and an 1840s plantation farmhouse. Nearby is **Founders Cemetery**, which contains 23 marked graves of some first families of Roswell and their slaves.
