DISCOVER Milledgeville

The 2013 Spring Ramble to Milledgeville is a weekend of stunning private homes, fascinating architectural gems and unique historic landmarks. Historic Liberty Street contains some of the city's most impressive examples of ante- and post-bellum architecture. Tour notable homes including the 1894 Harrington House, with its charming Queen Anne gingerbread trim and lovely turret with stained glass windows. Explore examples of the unique "Milledgeville Federal" style in homes such as The Cedars, which was built in 1822 and features a cantilevered balcony, inverted fluted Ionic columns, "floating" staircase and a hand-carved mantel.

Milledgeville is known for its public landmarks as well as its gracious homes. Visit the 1839 Old Governor's Mansion, which recently re-opened its doors after a comprehensive three-year restoration. Considered to be one of the most perfect examples of Greek Revival architecture in the state, it was home to the governors of Georgia from 1838 to 1868 and was occupied by General Sherman during his March to the Sea. Explore the fascinating 100-acre campus of Central State Hospital, established in 1842 as Georgia's first public psychiatric hospital.

Sunday brunch will be served at the magnificent 1852 Lockerly Hall, the centerpiece of the lovely grounds of the Lockerly Arboretum. The mansion was built by Daniel Reese Tucker on the site of Rose Hill, an 1839 residence. The Lockerly Arboretum Foundation was established in 1965, and the grounds were set aside as a public garden and educational facility. In 1998 the home was acquired by the Arboretum and opened to the public.



Heritage Reception

Heritage level members will enjoy a private reception at the 1828 Willis House, hosted by owners Mr. and Mrs. Mel Latham. This Federal/Greek Revival style house designed by John Marlor has been in Mrs. Latham's family since 1898. It was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 2003. WELCOME TO
Milledgeville

The antebellum capital of Georgia, the town of Milledgeville was approved by the state legislature in 1804 and convened its first General Assembly in 1807. The hilly frontier town began to grow as wealth and power gravitated toward the capital and the area's cotton industry prospered. Most of the handsome antebellum homes, churches and institutions in Milledgeville were constructed by black carpenters, masons, and laborers.

Milledgeville's Civil War history began on January 19, 1861, when the Georgia Convention passed the Ordinance of Secession. General William T. Sherman and 30,000 Federal troops marched into Milledgeville in 1864, ransacking the statehouse, destroying the state arsenal, and burning many structures in town and in the surrounding countryside.

When the state capital moved to Atlanta in 1867, Milledgeville worked hard to recover. The Middle Georgia Military & Agricultural College (later Georgia Military College) was established in 1879, Georgia Normal & Industrial College (now Georgia College & State University) was founded in 1889, and Central State Hospital grew to be the nation's largest public psychiatric hospital with over 13,000 patients.

The creation of Lake Sinclair north of downtown in the 1950s spurred the development of a nearby lake community that has become part of Milledgeville's economy. Starting in the 1980s, Milledgeville began the successful revitalization of the downtown and historic district, resulting in a vibrant town that welcomes visitors to explore its rich heritage.
